Curricular Aspects

Criteria 1 : Curricular Aspects

The college has an effective delivery of curriculum in a planned and documented way. Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Our college is located in rural urban area of Gunderdehi block, Balod District within 6.55 acres of land. The college was shifted to its new building in 2015. The built up area of the college building is 2206.15sq meters with 12 classrooms, 5 labs, 1 ICT enabled/seminar hall, 1 staff room, library with reading room facility. CCTV Surveillance is available in ground floor, 1st floor as well as in each classroom. There are separate washrooms for staff and students.

College library consists of more than 10000 books for students. Magazines, reading materials, notes and news paper for the students appearing for competitive exams are also available.

The PG department also provides library books for their PG students.

Sports activities are conducted by sports incharge. There is a gym Facility, Yoga Facility for Physical Fitness of Students and Faculty. Indoor games as well as outdoor games are also conducted in the college premises.

Infrastructure facilities are also maintained.ICT projector is available for modern innovative teaching and learning aspects. Drinking water facility with RO filters are available. There is a small garden inside the college premises."Vriksharopan" is done every year. There is a Bagbani committee to take care of the garden. Playground for outdoor sports like Volleyball, Football, Cricket, kho-kho and etc is available. Indoor sports are conducted inside the college premises.

Science students in UG and PG Geography students do practicals in their respective labs. Boundary wall construction is under process.

The college has a systemic planning and implementation of its university affiliated curriculum. By conducting the staff council meeting at the beginning of the session, the institution schedules the college time table for each faculty in accordance with the university academic calendar. The time table committee ensures that there is no over-lapping of classes and the need and requirement of the individual course is properly managed. Every teacher communicates the importance of the course in their classes. Every department maintains the teaching diary at their individual level and registers for attendance of the students. The professors also keep a record of curricular and extra-curricular activities. All these records are duly checked by the Head of the Institution. Practical learning in science stream and P.G. Geography is done in Laboratory. Environmental projects work in UG and summer internship programme in NSS are also carried out. The staff council meetings are organised periodically to bring out action plans for effective implementation of the curriculum.

2.2 Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Response:

Response:-

Every year diversified students from different backgrounds take admission in our institute. The capacity of learning of the students can be observed from their social and economic background and their personal abilities and attributes. The learning level of the students is assessed and monitored regularly for improving their overall performance. At the very beginning of the session every teacher discusses the syllabus with the students, continuous evaluation process is done through debate competition, essay competition, extempore, quiz and group discussion. Usually the fundamentals and basic concepts of the subjects are made to understand to the students. Tests are conducted in order to evaluate their overall performance. Slow learners and advanced learners are identified in the classrooms based on their previous results in UG and in PG. Orientation towards academics and feedback from subjects teachers are also considered where the social and psychological aspects are also considered. For better performance of the slow learners some task are given to them.

Advance learners are given the innovative methods of exposure in to the subject they find intresting.

Assessing learning level

At the time of admission the teacher do the counseling and get the pulse of the students, their knowledge level about the course by random oral test.

Motivating the slow learners.

Classes for English language are conducted for those who have poor level of understanding English.

Every department provides notes for slow learners students. Thus the basic skills of the student is improved. They are given assignments by their respective teachers. Their doubts are always cleared by the teachers.

Encouraging the advanced learners.

The advanced learners are encouraged and facilitated to read beyond the requirement of the syllabus. The students are provided reference book, competitive magazines.

Advanced learners are motivated to attend coaching classes conducted by the career guidance group in the surrounding area. Our staff also keep motivating the students.

Advanced learners are encouraged to inculcate the competitive edge within themselves.

Advanced learners are motivated to attend workshop seminars and publish papers.

2.3 Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Response:

Response :-

Teaching learning is a lifelong process. The teacher using his subject knowledge and effective teaching skills makes his student understand easily and also apply the knowledge gained wherever needed. More innovative and technology based teaching methods have been adopted by the teachers of the institute which has creative ways of sharing and facilitating knowledgeable ideas to the students. That is why the traditional teaching system are also useful wherever the institution does not have enough of the modern technology based teaching. The faculties have integrated student-centric teaching-learning process into their regular system of delivering. Thus more improvement in the teaching/learning method is attained in course outcomes, Program outcomes and program specific outcomes. Student centric methodsare adopted by the institution in which educational contents are conveyed to the student.

Following are the Student Centric Methods

Student Centric Methods for learning has been adopted by all the departments. Teaching methods differ in deferent disciplines. Interactive and collaborative learning among the student is done by group discussions paper presentation and participation in deferent college level competition as well as inter college level competition. Participating in debate and extempore encourages the student to become independent and take decision. Students in PG. Geography and Political science are encouraged to present paper in seminars organised at college level. Thus they learn the organising skills, time management, team work and responsibilities.

- **Direct Instruction:** The teacher directly helps students to learn, set and achieve their personal and educational goals. The students from the rural background need more support from the teacher, it helps to connect them with the teacher and their subject. The students feel inspired and the course outcome are better achieved.
- **Kinesthetic Learning:** Students of M.A. Geography, B.Sc. besides listening to lectures do physical activities related to their subjects example collection of herbs for making herbarium, go for a visits to historical place to know the geographical location and cultural heritage of the tribes.
- **Inquiry Based Learning:** Teacher puts concept, ask questions and answer their queries. Hence results or outcomes are obtained. Statistics, accounts and numerical in chemistry, etc are also inquiry based learning.
- **Blended Learning:** Both online, offline and face to face teaching / learning was adopted during Covid-19 period. Google links and whatsapp groups were made. Group projects are prepared by the students. The teachers and students collaborate for project based learning. Some students are self directed blended learners when they have their personalized inquiry, It makes them more independent.
- Mobile Learning: Past few years mobile has been used to access the learning content.
- **Virtual Learning:** Teaching/Learning was done with course materials given to students and both students and teachers interact with each other. The intention of virtual classroom learning is to replicate the experience of physical classrooms. This is a distance learning system adopted during Covid-19 where file sharing and instant feedback was also given.

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode

Response:

Response:-

Evaluation is a mode that has helped to improve the participation and punctuality of the student whether it is the matter attendance or completion of assignment. Each department works out on the details of how

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evaluation will be carried out each paper taking care that learning objectives of each paper are achieved through different assignment class tests. It provides an opportunity to relook at and reform teaching strategies if the students are not performing well. Students who miss the assignment due to ill health participation in the extra-curricular activities of the college are given an opportunity to give the assignments class tests on alternate date. The schedule for conducting the class tests is set and is known to students in advance.

The college conducts internal assessments exams for under graduates and post-graduate by strictly following the university academic calendar. These assessments exams semester exams and annual exams schedule are smoothly handled by the examination committee formed at the institution level. There are two types of examination committee to handle the assessment process and examination. There is a committee to look into the local examination/internal assessment.

As per the guide line of the university calendar. The other examination committee takes care of conducting annual practical exams and annual theory examination.

Each semester witnesses at least two internal examinations. Allotment of internal marks is as per the university mandate which prescribes the criteria of internal assessment marks and strategies one notified to the students and parents. The process of internal assessment/model examination is transparent and the reforms are ushered in on a regular basis.

For university examination as well as for internal examination time table is displayed on the notice board and in their respective WhatsApp group. The invigilator conduct classroom duty. The seating plan is also prepared. Examinations are conducted as per the syllabus declared by the university. The question papers—are received from the university annual examinations are kept in local Thana to maintain confidential decoram and are brought back to the college. As per the time-table of the subject the question paper are brought from thana to the center and later distributed on the date of the examination to the students through proper channel of examination procedure. During examination the attendance of students is maintained.

If there is any unfair means done by the student action is taken by the flying-squad, invigilator and the shift incharge of the shift. The entrance of students or unwanted people is restricted by the attendant. Admit card for examinee are allotted by on-line system and it is duly checked by the respective professor before the candidates enters the examination hall.

2.5.2 Mechanism to deal with internal/external examination related grievances is transparent, timebound and efficient

Response:

Response:-

An efficient and transparent mechanism has been developed at the College level to deal with examination related grievances. Adequate measures are taken to ensure that the evaluation is objective and systematic. The faculty are trained to set question papers without any ambiguity. The students are made familiar with the process of assessment by the class mentors. The paper valuators follow the scheme of valuation as discussed in the departments so that there is uniformity in valuation.

At institutional level the question papers are distributed to the students and examination are conducted the faculty discuss the question paper and their subsequent answers. This helps the students understand and note down their correction. Teachers are given sufficient time to evaluate the answer scripts in order to avoid erratic valuation.

Students have a provision for personal seeing of the answer scripts. Totalling errors and uncorrected answers, if any, will be rectified by the subject teachers. Any grievance regarding evaluation is addressed to the concerned faculty handling that subject. Any discrepancy noticed is brought to the concerned teacher. Students are allowed to examine their evaluated answer scripts and point out the discrepancies, if any, in the presence of the teacher. Any grievance which cannot be resolved at that level is referred to the Head of Department, or the Principal.

The assessment involves the conduct of two internal examination, assignments, seminars and weightage for student's attendance. The practical examinations are conducted with the help of an external examiner as per the mandate of the university. The question papers for annual exams are prepared and submitted to the Examination Committee of the university. Before three weeks of commencement of internal examination, examination dates are announced to the Students and time table is displayed in the notice board of the college.

Question papers are based on multiple choice and descriptive type. Duration of the university examination is three hours..

As a part of academic evaluation each department conducts seminars, assignments, projects, internships, class participation and viva voce for allotting internal marks. These types of evaluations will enhance the knowledge and confidence of the students in order to achieve better success. All the departments follow the above criteria for allotting internal assessment marks. Periodic instructions related to examinations and evaluation received from the university is communicated to the students through circulars which is read in every class room by the professors and also displayed on the notice boards. The eligibility criteria for the final examinations are made clear to students at the beginning of the semester and the evaluation process is reviewed in staff meetings.

Ideal education aims at the attainment of a holistic development of the student. Programmes are designed in such a way that the students are trained into responsible citizens capable of gainful employment. Being aware of its responsibility, organizes the teaching-learning strategies so that students are able to equip themselves with the proposed outcomes of the programme. The institution being an affiliated college, it does not have much leverage in terms of evaluation. However the institution never plans innovative strategies of evaluation. The student's capabilities in terms of understanding the course outcomes are evaluated through comprehensive testing methods and interactive method.

The process of attainment of POs, PSOs and COs starts with developing appropriate COs for each course in the undergraduate courses. The course outcomes (COs) are developed by the respective faculty in charge based on the curriculum. The attainment of the programme outcomes and programme specific outcomes are assessed at a weighted average of direct assessment and indirect assessment. The assessment weightage of 70% is given to direct attainment and 30% to indirect attainment. The direct and indirect method of attainment of program outcomes and program specific outcomes are:

Direct Methods: The student performance in the examination during the end of each semester in each course is used as a medium to assess the level of attainment of POs and PSOs through the mapping of questions to course outcomes and programme outcomes.

Indirect Method: The comprehensive feedback system is followed and feedback is collected from the students at the end of the programme, which assess the attainment of POs and PSOs. Additionally, student performance in co-curricular, extra-curricular, extended learning, job placement, higher studies are used as a tool for the assessment of POs and PSOs.

The course outcomes are assessed based on mid-semester and examination, and other student centric assessment methods like assignments, seminars, projects, group discussion and quiz.

End semester examinations are conducted by the affiliating university focused on attainment of course outcomes and program outcomes through a comprehensive descriptive method.

Besides the written examinations the assignment/seminars are assigned to each covering COs and POs throughout the programme in each course. Marks are assigned depending on student performance.

Govt. Shahid Koushal Yadav College takes an initiative to promote and facilitate knowledge creation, innovation and entrepreneurship activities on and off the campus for the student community.

Within constraint parameters the college has created an ideal ambience for generation and transfer of knowledge. Innovation and creativity are two factors that set institution at par excellence. The college is located in the rural area of Gunderdehi Block.

Although the college does not have a separate Incubation Centre, the student of B.Sc. and M.A. Geography have come up with innovative ideas enhanced in their theoretical and practical knowledge.

Innovation and Initiatives taken by B.Sc. Students:-The students of B.Sc. stream have Microbiology a subject in their curriculum. In this subject they study about the isolation of bacteria and fungus from the soil, water and air. The presence of the bacteria on the surface of the leaves that is 'phylosphere' and in the surrounding area of roots of plants 'rhizosphere' are studied by the Microbiology students. They are taught to test the sensitivity of the bacteria in the atmosphere. Antibiotic sensitivity test is conducted. Azithromycin and tetracycline antibiotics are used to treat bacterial infections in the infected plants and roots etc. Therefore the students of Microbiology acquire practical knowledge to protect the plants, trees and soil. Their subject knowledge has created platform for their research study.

The students of B.Sc. Microbiology also do the blood-group test by slide agglutination method. They come to know their blood-group. Whenever there is any emergency or blood donation is required the students readily agree to donate blood. The advantage of this curriculum is that the students know their blood-group and can help whenever there is need.

It is noted that the Red-Cross Unit of the college have these students as their members. Blood donation camp has been organised several times by Red-Cross Unit.

M.A.-Geography students study Biogeography and environmental Geography which helps to understand the interactions between and among the environment, animals, plants and man. The students of the this faculty thus learn to protect the environment from natural disaster hazards. The students also learn the cause, effect management mitigation of various environmental issues like climate change, global warming, pollution and biodiversity loss. The students have made an attempt to express their concept of biodiversity and its importance. The college garden has variety of flora and fauna and the twittering of birds is a small glimpse of ecological balance.

01 Internal examinations and assessment.

The college reviews its teaching learning process, structure and methodologies of operations and learning outcomes as directed by the thought process of IQAC team. Academic input should be analysed and evaluated periodically to ensure that the programme and course outcome are understood.

Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) is done by conducting class test making the student capable of internal external exams. The college conduces text and model exam for under graduates for post graduates there are internal assessment exam at least twice a semester for every subject these exam are taken under the University pattern. Each faculty keeps record of internal exams, model exam and internal assessment exam. The marks of internal exam for UG and internal assessment exam PG is sent to the University for making the final result.

The time table of the annual exam is announced at least 21 days ahead of the starting of the annual examination students with complete eligibility are accepted and permitted to appear in the examination. The students who have 75% attendance are eligible for the examination.

Projects making are also a part of assessment. The students are given a topic to prepare project work which counts their assignment. Internal exam for UG/internal assessment exam for PG helps the students secure better result.

This system is evaluation is an effective. And the issues are dealt with justice and open mindedness.

The sitting plan for the examination is designed by the examination committee As per the University schedule the time table is prepared for every faculty and displayed on the notice board of the college for the students. Accordingly the students are given the admit card for their exam.

The annual exams are carried out in three shifts, B.Sc. faculty morning shift, B.Com day shift, B.A. evening shift. All post graduations exam are conducted in morning shift. The examination committee chalks out the sitting plan, invigilators duty. The University distributes the question paper to the respective colleges and the centres for exam, 10 days before the commencement of the exam in every subject.

Every teacher as a mentor ensures the students that they are able to excel in academic and have good character.

02 Reforms in teaching learning.

The IQAC in its meetings always suggest to have changes in teaching and learning method they recommend the faculty to adopt pedagogical method the teachers are given a chance to participate in faculty development programme FDP, seminars, conferences and workshops. The teachers get the ideas of new methodologies in teaching. The faculty take the advantage of ICT enabled technology their teaching.

Learning has thus become more attractive for the students who adjust with the ICT teaching. Mobile Digital learning is another effective use of modern technology that makes students smatter. The student in

There is peace progress and harmony in this world when each and every individual try to contribute the goodness to the society in which he/she belongs thus under SVEEP (Systematic Voters Education and Electoral Participation) Plan of the Institution has been actively organising the outreach programs to motivate the students, the villagers, the stakeholders to be a responsible citizen. They teach to actively participate in voting whenever there is election whether Lok Sabha, Assembly, JanPad or Municipal Election, every single vote is important for election. The message is conveyed to everyone by playing "Nukkad Natak" at the streets, Bus Stand, etc.
- The Institution also organizes debates, rallies, human chain, to give social awareness programs on EVM machines, Voting and Importance of Voters. With the efforts of Nodal Officer, SVEEP Plan a list of about more than 22 voters were made. Every year Mat Data Diwas is celebrated on 25th January.
- NSS Unit of the Institution is quite active throughout and over past years it has organised programs on Summer Internship, Tree Plantation, Swachhata Abhiyan, Blood Donation drives, Adoption of Village, AIDS Awareness programs, Personality Development Program, Spoken English______. In addition to these NSS Unit organises 7 days camp in villages to render their services in the villages and motivate the local communities to remain hygienic and literated.
- Inculcating the moral values and ethics among the students: The importance of moral values, sincerity, hard work, generosity and truth are important qualities for the citizens of a Nation. Adhering to these qualities of being Sincere, Non-Violent, the college celebrates Gandhi Jayanti every year.150th anniversary of Gandhi Jayanti in the College Premises was celebrated. The students were allowed to participate in various competitions organised following Gandhi Vichar Dhara, Swachhta Abhiyan. Moral values like respecting every individual and religion, justice, honesty, love for the nation, charity is expected from the students whenever we organise programs.
- Promoting the sense of Cultural Heritage among the students. India is a country with unique and distinctive culture of many religions .One of the best practices of this Institution is to have cultural heritage awareness.
- The students of this Institute are taught to have sense of belongingness which is the pride of our culture. All the festivals of India, Rural festivals are celebrated with enthusiasm. Every year the Institution celebrates Annual Day, "Sneh Samilan". The students participate in Music, Dance, Nukkad Natak, Rangoli thus portraying the Cultural Diversity. Program on making Clay Artworks was conducted in the college. Program on making Jewelry from dhan was conducted by the students
